

Terms & Conditions

> The Safari Corporation CC <

1. Reservations and Payment schedule

Enquiries and reservations are made by contacting The Safari Corporation CC. When the quote has been accepted and The Safari Corporation CC has received a written confirmation, The Safari Corporation CC will issue a confirmation pro-forma invoice. Requesting payment of 50% of Safari after receipt of invoice. The other 50% is payable upon arrival at BURG GUSINDE.

2. Cancellations and Refunds

Postponements or cancellations of a booking must be made in writing to The Safari Corporation CC and shall only be effective upon acknowledged receipt by The Safari Corporation CC. In the event of a cancellation, you will be obliged to pay a fee according to the following charges:

- a.) between 30 & 25 days, 20% of the Safari cost.
- b.) between 24 & 10 days, 40% of the Safari cost
- c.) between 09 & 02 days, 70% of the Safari cost.
- d.) within 48 hours or no-show, 100% of the Safari cost.

The Safari Corporation CC will not give any refunds or compensation for: loss of length of travel time, substitution of facilities, amendment to the safari itinerary after departure, circumstances arising beyond the Company's control, necessitating alternative arrangements to ensure the safety and/or further participation and enjoyment of the safari, failure to commence the trip or leave it prior to its completion.

3. Booking agents, Airlines & Local Operators

The Safari Corporation CC acts as a booking agent when requested or necessary, for hotels, airlines, air charters, ground transportations and other independent contractors. Each of these companies are independent corporations with their own management hence are not subject to the control of

The Safari Corporation CC; the transportation, accommodation and other services provided by the ground operators are offered subject to their terms and conditions. The Safari Corporation CC does not have the control of the independent operators and therefore cannot be liable for any delay, events beyond control, personal injury, property loss or damage which may arise out of the services.

4. Risks

The Safari Corporation CC draws your attention to the fact that there are certain inherent risks involved in participating in safaris and that you must accept them at your own risk. Neither the company nor its employees can be held responsible for any illness, injury or accident on the safari.

5. Force Majeure

“Force Majeure” means, in relation to The Safari Corporation CC, any circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the company (including, but without limitation, acts of God, explosion, flood, tempest, fire or accident, war or thread of war, sabotage, insurrection, civil disturbance, requisition, Government intervention, weather conditions or other untoward occurrences). If The safari Corporation CC is affected by Force Majeure it shall immediately notify you of the nature and the extent thereof. The Safari Corporation CC shall not be deemed to be in breach of these terms and conditions or otherwise be liable to you, be reason of delay in performance, or by non-performance, of any of its obligations hereunder to the extent that any such delay or non-performance is due to any Force Majeure.

Regarding civil unrest, once The Safari Corporation CC has investigated the prevailing situation as it deems fit, it shall remain in The Safari Corporations’ sole and absolute discretion whether to proceed with the trip. You may in such circumstance cancel the trip. However, if, after having made all reasonable proper enquiries, The Safari Corporation CC is of the opinion that the trip may proceed, no refund will be payable to you and the provision of the above clause shall apply.

6. Surcharges

Although The Safari Corporation CC hopes that it will not need to levy surcharges, it reserves the right to do so on the invoice amount, if this becomes necessary due to increases forced upon the company by airlines, exchange rates etc.

The Safari Corporation CC will endeavour to notify you in writing as soon as it is aware of any likely surcharge and reserves the right to surcharge up to a maximum of 10% of the trip.

7. Baggage

Temporary or permanent loss of baggage is the responsibility of the client or the carrier. It is not the responsibility of the company and any expense involved in such a loss is entirely the client's or the respective carrier's responsibility.

8. Insurance

The Safari Corporation CC strongly recommends and advises you to obtain the following types of insurance which are commercially available.

Accident Death and Disability

Major Medical

Emergency Medical Evacuation

Loss of Personal Effects

Trip Cancellation.

You will not be covered by any form of insurance by The Safari Corporation CC.

You undertake the safari and/or any other trip arranged by The Safari Corporation CC at your own risk.

It is your responsibility to ensure that all passports, visas, travel permits, health certificates, inoculations or other documents required for the safari are obtained and are in order. It will be your responsibility to meet any additional costs incurred as a result of any failure by you to comply with such requirements.

You should comply with the instructions of The Safari Corporations' representatives at all times. No client shall be accepted or permitted to continue a safari while their status, mental or physical condition is, in the opinion of the representatives of the company, such as to render them incapable of caring for themselves, become objectionable to themselves or other clients. The company

will not be responsible for expenses incurred by such persons precluded from completing the safari for this reason.

All information given in any of our brochures in respect of the safaris is, to the best of The Safari Corporations' knowledge, correct at the time of going to press but the company reserves the right to change.

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the Laws of Namibia.

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
